Training for professionals: Early Eating Behaviour Problems - Diagnostics & Intervention

WHAT DOES E.A.T. DOC MEAN?

Working with infants and young children implies a sensitive and empathic approach as well as good skills in non-verbal and verbal communication.

E.A.T. stands for **Early Autonomy Training** and is a **concept with implications for diagnostic assessment** (using the **DC 0-3R system**), therapeutic intervention focused on the child's abilities and the parent-child relationship and quality of interaction and associated research projects.

DOC's stands for any professional with his or her main focus on infancy and early childhood. This can be a medical doctor of any subspecialty, nurse, midwife, psychologist, psychotherapist, speech- and language therapist, occupational-physiotherapist, social worker or early intervention worker. The most frequent presenting clinical target symptoms are early eating behaviour disorders, tube dependency and other functional problems like picky eating, excessive screaming, regulatory disorders and sleep disorders. **Early Autonomy Training DOCUMENTATION** is also a documentation system serving the research projects of our group which incorporates valuable information collected during the preparation-, assessment-, treatment- and aftercare-phase of each child. The children treated as patients in Graz make up the study group (SG), the patients of the Net-Coaching program (www.notube.at) the control group (CG).
